Libraries Change Lives - Interlibrary Loans

Laura Lenz is taking online classes to complete parts of her master's; her thesis involves original research that requires a literature review of many, many books. This is where the interlibrary loan service works so well. She is able to find the books she needs in the numerous Twin Cities college libraries, request them, reserve them if needed and have them delivered to Rochester. Between the telephone and computers she saves a lot of time. She states that the reference desk staff is very helpful with extending renewal times, when the responsibilities of a husband and two elementary aged children cut into available reading time.

She and some friends formed a book club and have found the library's Book-Group-in-a-Bag to be a fun resource; they have read and discussed *Memoirs'* of a Geisha and Pride and Prejudice recently.

Laura's family also enjoys the Hooray for Saturday programs. She notes that the library was one of the family's first locations to visit in Rochester after leaving Minneapolis. They stopped during their first week in town, leaving impressed with the services offered and finding the people they interacted with to be experts in their areas.






