The theme for this year's Summer Reading Program is "Fiction into Film" and will feature this winning logo.



Libraries Change Lives

Rebekah Crowley, a first grader at St Pius X grade school, decided that she would like to participate in the science fair this year for the first time. The Crowleys are regular library users, and while visiting the Children's area one day they noticed a display of science fair books next to the fish tank. A book entitled I Get Wet appealed to Rebekah, so she decided to do a project about wetness. The name of her science fair project was "Does Everything that Touches Water Stay Wet?" In her experiment, Rebekah compared wetness properties of wax paper and cloth. After being submerged in dyed water, wax paper does not stay wet. Dyed water droplets roll off of it leaving it dry and unchanged. Cloth on the other hand absorbs the dyed water, gets wet and even changes color. So in answer to her question...No, not everything that touches water stays wet! All science fair participants were awarded a red ribbon, but Rebekah was given a blue ribbon for "Best Effort"!

Following is Rebekah's library story in her own words.

The library helped me with my science project. I found a book that used water in an experiment. I used the information and got a blue ribbon.


