Minnesota Library Information Network (MnLINK)

The Rochester Public Library (RPL) has joined the Minnesota Library Information Network (MnLINK) which links library catalogs across the state of Minnesota. This will make obtaining almost any title or library item much easier and more convenient than ever. The Rochester Public Library is often celebrated for the depth and breadth of its collection of materials. Currently the library owns over 460,000 items including books, audio books, films, music CDs, eMedia, magazines, and newspapers. Joining MnLINK will open additional library collections to library users. "MnLINK is one-stop

shopping for materials in almost any Minnesota library and it is free of charge to library card holders," said reference librarian, Greg Sauve. "MnLINK is becoming very popular with library users. We have seen a significant increase in our residents requesting materials from other libraries, and conversely members of other libraries requesting more items from us."

Notable libraries that belong to Mn-LINK include University of Minnesota libraries, state college libraries, private college libraries and most major public library systems around

the state. MnLINK is funded in part by the State of Minnesota, through an appropriation to the Minnesota Office of Higher Education.

You can use MnLINK on any computer with Internet access. Just go to the library website, www.RochesterPublicLibrary.org, and search our catalog for the desired item. If we don't own it, just click on "Search other Libraries" and you will be led to the MnLINK page.
