World Music Series – Oliver Mtukudzi Auditorium 3

3pm Zimbabwe's pride, most successful artist and national treasure, Oliver Mtukudzi is gifted with a deep and gusty voice plus a talent for writing songs that reflect on the daily life and struggles of his people. 'Tuku' as he is known, began performing in 1977 and has earned a devoted following across Africa and beyond, all the while incorporating elements of different musical traditions. He sings in the nation's dominant Shona language as well as Ndebele and English.

His music also incorporates South Africa mbaqanga, the energetic Zimbabwean pop style jit, and the traditional kateke drumming of his clan.

The Friends plan on holding an annual celebration of Rochester authors and have already scheduled next year's event for Thursday, July 18, 2013.


