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# AmaZING Woman: Pat Stephenson

This month's story recognizes a long-time library volunteer, Pat Stephenson, who was nominated by Cathie Armstrong, another Library Friend, for the KTTC AmaZING woman award. Pat was selected as the February winner and KTTC came and filmed Pat at the Library and gave her a package of prizes. The segment about Pat will air throughout February.

Tell us about this AmaZING Woman. Focus on the number one reason why she should be recognized: Pat Stephenson is, without a doubt, the "literacy guru" of Rochester, MN. This woman (now retired) puts in the equivalent of a full-time job volunteering at the Rochester Public Library. In her "free time" away from the library, she volunteers in any other capacity for any organization that needs assistance with books or literacy. She seems to be on a one-woman mission to make sure that people of all ages have access to books, and it really does seem to encompass every aspect of her life. I've known Pat for more than 10 years, since she was a Library Para at Bamber Valley. While there, she spent her days finding ways to encourage children to read simply for the love of reading. She even identified students with younger siblings and made families aware of the Dolly Pardon Imagination Library that gives free books each month to children under the age of 5...that's up to 60 free books per child! What an amazing way to encourage reading! Since retiring, Pat has dedicated her time to the Rochester Public Library and Friends of the Library Bookstore where she most certainly works a full time job without pay. She volunteers to work the bookstore, organizes 2nd Saturday Sales,

helps with the huge auditorium sales, and even signs up yearly for World Book Night and dispenses copies of free books to non-readers. And it doesn't stop there. In addition to her time at the library, I know Pat has spent hundreds of hours collecting, organizing and distributing books for a variety of other local places where books might be utilized. Places like the Ronald McDonald House and (I believe) the Women's Shelter and Dorothy Day House. When she's not volunteering at the library or distributing books for those in need, she can often be found at one of the local elementary school libraries - often in costume - supporting whatever their needs might be. If it involves books (and especially children and books), you can be sure that Pat will pick up the gauntlet and run with it. You don't even have to "ask" her for help. Frequently you just need to mention that something is going on and that volunteers might be needed and she jumps into the fire to help make it happen. Pat is truly an amaZING woman and has single-handedly done more for literacy in Rochester than any other individual or group combined.".

Pat joined the library as a volunteer in 1978, she has served on the Friends Board and is a Past President, over the years she has given us thousands of hours of her time. One of Pat's signature achievements is the Read with Me Program established over 20 years ago, in collaboration with Carolyn Stanson another wonderful Friend's member. The program ensure every baby born in Rochester receives a free book paid for by the Friends and information about the Library and it's programs. Over the years Pat has probably put together and distributed over 50,000 packets.

One of the more visible items that Pat added to the library in the past year or so was Paige Turner a life sized mannequin that she dresses depending on the season and events going on at the library and in the Friends area and the bookstore. The other notable accomplishment is on-line book sales. After books are donated to the library the Friends sort the books and then the library staff choose quite a number to put back on the shelves as books to be checked out by patrons which means that they don't need to be purchased. The sorters then put books on a cart that Pat and a helper scan looking for titles that book companies are offering to buy. This has turned into a very lucrative source of money for the library both as real money and credit for staff to use to purchase more books for the library this was a complete Pat idea that was been awesome.

Pat is a true book lover, loves helping the library and has found unique and creative ways to bring funds to the library which allows the library to purchase more materials for the people that use the library.




