### DAVID BARRY

December 28th, 2013 at 3:15AM, an arsonist set fire to the apartment building in which I was living. Thankfully no one was injured. The building was no longer habitable and after three days in a motel paid for by the Red Cross, at the tender age of 66, I was homeless for the first time in my life

Let me share a story with you:

A few years ago, my dog Zelda and I embarked upon an 18-month camping trip around the United States. We stayed very close to the Canadian border; hugged highway 101 down the west coast; crept along the Mexican

border and the Gulf of Mexico until we landed in Key West, Florida.

After two months, we departed Florida; we followed coast roads and used ferries to take us to Washington, D.C. We spent a week there, but that April was unseasonably cold in the Northeast

that year, so Zelda and I made a left at the nation's capitol and travelled to Arkansas to see a woman (It's always a woman, isn't it?) we'd met months before in Florida.

I'm telling you this because to stay connected to email, national and world news, and a few blogs I like, we utilized over 150 public libraries around the

country. Some of them were grand affairs; others were no larger than a walk-in closet. My point is: I have been to many, many libraries. Many.

Now I'm moving to Rochester primarily for the Rochester Public Library.

To me, a library is the key to any well run

city. And, to me, after all of my travels, Rochester has a great library!

As you may have guessed, I am an avid, even voracious reader. I've been

reading since I was six and I have loved almost every word, sentence and paragraph of the thousands of books I have read in my sixty-one year literate life. Truly I have.

A side note: on our trip, many people asked how Zelda got her name. Simple: I originally wanted two dogs, a male and a female. I never found the right male dog, but I was going to name him F. Scott.





# THE ART OF MUSIC

The Rochester Public Library received a SELCO community collaboration grant to contract with artist Peter Lex to create a mural in the new music area. The mural design was inspired by Kandinsky's musical images and incorporated silhouettes of jazz musicians.

The newly repurposed Music Area contains the library's recorded music collection and comfortable seating with outlets to encourage mobile device usage. The setting has been designed to provide places to listen, read, relax, and collaborate.



In addition, the library will be collaborating with the Southeastern Minnesota Youth Orchestra (SEMYO) and the Choral Arts Ensemble to highlight and promote the mural at a special event on Saturday, July 12th at 11:00 am.

The Art of Music project ties directly to the library's strategic plan which has the goal "Engage the Community" with the initiative "Communities members have expanded opportunities for creative expression and innovation". In addition, the Art of Music mural will provide a lasting visual impact for patrons to enjoy for years to come.
