

Yes, the Rochester Public Library is HERE with Instant Messaging. During hours the library is open, a reference librarian is available to answer questions with users of AIM, Yahoo or MSN instant messaging services.

The Library screenname is RPLmnInfo for Aim and Yahoo. MSN users can IM us at reference@rochester.lib.mn.us.

Some sample questions that might be asked on IM:

- I need articles on Kelly Clarkson
- What's a good website for converting dollars to British pounds?
- Do you have study guides for the SAT test?
- Can I find an online map of Costa Rica?
- Where can I get criticisms of Fitzgerald's works?

IM Reference is part of our regular reference service, which includes in-person and telephone reference services. Sometimes we might be answering all kinds of questions at the same time, so please be patient when asking a question.

#### From the Director

The library seeks community input in order to ensure that we are meeting everyone's needs, so we contracted with a



marketing research firm to collect community input about library services. In August and September, 2005, SNG Research conducted telephone surveys of Olmsted County residents on our behalf. The survey averaged 15 minutes, so we really appreciate



everyone who took the time to answer it. The survey was partially funded by the Rochester Public Library Foundation.

We learned that the library is very important to

members of our community:

- 8 out of 10 households have a library card
- 93% of the people surveyed value the library for the community.

And we also learned that we need to promote some of our resources and services better:

• Many people were not aware of the magazines, newspapers, and other information available via the Library's website.

• Many people were not aware of homebound services.

We also asked about satisfaction with hours and location. We asked about increased support to maintain existing services, add a branch location, and add hours. We've spent hours looking through the data, discussing the data, and assimilating what it means. The Library Board and staff are adjusting direction and planning for the future based on the findings of the study.

voted to purchase software to update the library's adaptive workstation to support the access of library materials and Internet content to those who are blind or visually handicapped and to those with reading impairments. The adaptive workstation scans material and translates the print into voice. It enlarges text on the computer screen and translates it to voice. A printer is attached which translates text into braille. This is one of several costly special projects that the *Friends* support to help make material and services available to all patrons of the library.
