

Recycle printer cartridges

It benefits both the environment, and the *Rochester Public Library*. That is the purpose of an Eagle Scout Leadership Service

Recycling Project designed by Bruce Gregoire, a member of Boy Scout Troop 29, sponsored by Rochester Central Lutheran School. He met with several businesses who've agreed to donate used printer cartridges to the Library. Book marks describing the program are available at the Library. The public is invited to put used ink jet, laser printer cartridges or old cell phones in labeled bins in library entrance or outside near the bookmobile garage door after hours. A volunteer will send the cartridges away to be recycled. The Friends will get an average of \$1.50 per cartridge. The funds will be used to support the library. "A few businesses I talked to did not have a plan to recycle their cartridges," Bruce said. "I hope my project benefits the environment and the Library." Any individual, business, or organization that wants to participate should drop their cartridges off at the library.

From the Director

The Library has been working hard to promote online resources.



- You may have seen the billboards up around town promoting some of the online resources, including genealogy, car repair, online tests, and online newspapers. The billboard art work was generously created for us by Think. Think and Magic Media have donated some billboard space.
- Carrie and I have been out talking to service clubs about online resources.
- There was an editorial in the Post-Bulletin during National Library Week that focused on online resources.

I hope all of you know about these treasures. They are funded by your tax dollars, so no additional contribution is required.

Did you know that from the library website you can:

- Read more than 150 newspapers online. This includes the Wall Street Journal, New York Times (you can even read the New York Times back to 1851), and the Minneapolis Star Tribune.
- Consult car repair manuals. You have access to information on every major manufacturer of domestic and imported vehicles.
- Get articles from thousands of magazines and journals.
- Research your genealogy with such well known resources such as Ancestry Plus and Heritage Quest.
- Research legal information with WestLaw.
- Obtain many, many useful resources for students to use for school work such as biographies, literary criticism, and encyclopedias.
- Take practice tests for the ACT, SAT, GED, nursing, fire fighting, TOEFL, elementary, middle school, and high school skills, and many more.

If you are seeking fast, convenient, and accurate information, then I would argue that the most powerful search engines are the professional librarians that staff our reference desk. All of the librarians have a master's degree in Library and Information Science and they are specialists in information seeking. They will help you find the information that you are seeking whether it is available on the Internet, in licensed online resources, or in a book at the library.

With the right tools and know-how, most information requests can be satisfied.


days and staying open later, till 6 pm on the first two. Our sales are works in progress and we will be asking for feedback. Don't be shy!

Successful Sale

We thought the best way to celebrate National Library Week was to give everyone more opportunities to read. So we had a Book Sale on April 20!

Twenty two Friends were waiting at the door for their early admission at 9:30. By 3 pm we'd counted almost 150 customers. Thanks to their generous donations we raised \$900 for Friends' projects.

Nineteen volunteers put in about 73 hours of work to make this happen. We moved tables, boxes, books and more books. There was a special section of rare and unusual books that sold briskly. People visited, shopped and then went on to shop in the Bookstore. Our book donations this year have been outstanding, and we needed to make room in the sorting area. We were fortunate to make money in the process.

We asked customers to fill out a short survey. Out of 74 responders: 22 were Friends, 18 had not been to a Friends' book sale before, and all but 2 felt there was a good selection of material. All agreed they liked payment by donation, 3 wrote they liked suggested prices. Other comments included appreciation for the volunteers and for the Friends' sponsorship.

The sale was a gratifying experience on many levels. It could not have happened without our hard-working volunteers - some of them first timers, the library staff, particularly the custodians, and all our generous patrons. Thank you all again for coming out! Theresa Friedhoff


