From the Director

The Library Helps Students Succeed



The Rochester Public Library has always been a

place for students to turn for help with school work. Librarians assist students in finding books, journal articles, DVDs, and other materials to research and write papers. Staff helps students find science experiments for science fairs. Copies of classic literature and literary criticism are used for English classes. Computers and laser printers are provided for typing up papers for those who don't have computers at home. Students get personal help from community volunteers three evenings a week at the Homework Assistance program at the library. This only scratches the surface on how the library is already working with learners of all ages to succeed.

Starting September 1st, the Rochester Public Library is providing another service to students. Tutors from 4 pm to 10 pm every night of the week are provided through a service called Tutor.com. The student starts at the library's web page. She enters her library card to verify that she's a library card holder from the Rochester Public Library; this is required for licensing. Then she's connected to Tutor.com where she indicates her grade and subject, and she's connected to a tutor.


A student can even send a paper in for the tutor to proof.

Library staff have been talking, planning, and working to fund this service for more than two years. Funding is being provided by the Rochester Public Library Foundation, Rotary Basketball Tournament proceeds, and Charles and Barbara Withers.

An implementation team of library staff and school personnel has been planning for months. Marketing this service is very important because it only benefits the students and parents if they know about it and use it. Staff will be at many open houses as the school year begins and at the Education Summit on September 6th. Every student will get a folder with information about Tutor.com. Library cards and information about the service have been mailed to many Olmsted County students. You may have even seen a bus with information about Tutor.com.

If you know someone who can benefit from this service, please let them know!

New Security Camera in the Bookstore

The Friends of the Library received a grant from Carl and Verna Schmidt Foundation to provide funds for a new security camera in the Bookstore. A recent incident brought to our attention the need for a volunteer to be able to ask for assistance quickly without leaving the store and to be able to identify persons whose behavior was unacceptable in the Library. In addition to the panic button, which should be used only in extreme emergencies, and the walkie talkie, which connects the book store to the front desk, volunteers now have immediate access to assistance. The camera will be focused on the checkout area and will record any unusual occurrences and help with identification. Our thanks to the Schmidt Foundation for funds to insure the safety of our volunteers and customers.


