September is membership renewal time. The Friends of the Rochester Library will celebrate our 60th Anniversary Sunday, September 20th from 2 to 4 pm in the Library Auditorium. Theresa Friedhoff chairs the committee of past presidents: Al Dollerschell, Karen Krueger, Elaine Schmidt, and Joyce Wenz. Come join us for memories, familiar friends, refreshments and a short program.

The Fall Book Sale will be Sunday, **October 4th** in the Library Auditorium from 1:30 pm -4:00 pm. Friends are admitted at 1:00 pm through the bookstore.

Our Online Sales team sells books on the Internet all year long: Al Dollerschell—Amazon worldwide, Pat Stephenson— text books with various vendors, Sylvie Nickel and Carol Smyrk- Unusual & Special books on Amazon as well as onsite sales. So far this year, online sales are just over \$7,000! Online sales contribute significantly to our \$22,000 pledge to the Library for programming and items not included in the budget. Remember we get 5% of sales on Amazon when you go to the Library Web site, click on Friends and then click on Amazon to do your shopping.

The Friends pay for one parking space for volunteers in the ramp. R.S.V.P. pays for one space and the Library two spaces. When you volunteer at the Library, sign your parking ticket with your name, and Library Volunteer, and R.S.V.P., if you are a member of RSVP.

Our Holiday Gift Book and Bake Sale is Sunday, **December 6th** in the Library Auditorium from 1:30 pm to 4:00 pm. Friends are admitted at 1:00 pm. Shop for presents and good food to eat and give.


Then and Now

"Fine" is just the right word for the array of *Unusual & Special* donated books that the Friends offer at the auditorium sales, on Amazon.com, and in the Bookstore. The U&S team researches the books online to determine whether they are truly "collectible" and valuable, and what prices are appropriate.

At the October sale, we'll have a <u>selection of very, very old books</u> – <u>published pre-1900</u>. It's awesome just to hold them in your hands and imagine who once read them.

We always have many whimsical, colorful, <u>exquisitely illustrated</u> <u>"children's" books</u> – irresistible to "grownup kids." Remember the Thornton Wilder/Harrison Cady animal stories?

We still have several titles in Laura Ingalls Wilder's "Little House" Prairie" series -- the 1930s editions featuring the illustrations of Helen Sewell.

And we have serious books, too:

- <u>Lost Moon</u>, signed by author Jim Lovell a memoir of the historic Apollo 13 mission
- <u>Itinerary of a Breakfast</u> (1926) by J H Kellogg (yes, one of the Battle Creek, MI Kelloggs)
- <u>Destiny Ours "If They Tell You I'm Missing</u>," signed by author William F Duffy, Jr., who recreates his father's WWII experiences.

Next issue we'll feature more of the wonderful Unusual & Special donations that arrive almost daily. And watch for our displays, whenever we can "rent" the glass case on the Library main floor. See you at the U&S table in October.

The Friends of the Rochester Public Library have recently become involved with the organization, United Through Reading. This nonprofit public business organization's mission is to unite families facing physical separation by facilitating the bonding experience of reading aloud together. The organization's Military Program helps ease the stress of separation for military families by having deployed parents read children's books aloud and recorded on a DVD for their children to watch at home.

This program is available to all deploying military units and at select USA locations. It provides parents a chance to make powerful and lasting connections with their children from afar.

Friends' Bookstore News



For some of us, browsing is a lost art. It recently occurred to me that I don't actually *use* the library like I used to. Not that I don't go to the library—between volunteering in the Friends' Bookstore, meetings, and other activi-

ties, I'm there at least twice a week. But it's been ages since I actually just wandered around in the stacks looking at materials.

We all seem to be in a hurry, so convenience wins the day. Our wonderful library staff make it very easy to reserve materials. You can just get on the RPL website from the comfort of home, place a hold on a book, then run downtown and pick it up. It is so convenient, in fact, that the held books are filed right by the main entrance where you don't even have to walk past any other books to get the one you reserved. You just check it out and leave. In a way, this is a lot like wearing blinders.

I didn't realize how I was limiting myself until I was early for a meeting a few weeks ago. Up on second floor, with time to kill, I discovered an interesting display of Minnesota travel books. I picked up one and then another, learning as I went, until at last I found a book about the Boundary Waters. I was completely taken in, and it planted a seed of longing in me and later, when I told my husband about it, we decided to squeeze in another canoe trip up there yet this fall. (Is this is how libraries change lives?)

Take some advice. Pause to remember how fun it is to go to the library and look at, for example, gardening books. You go looking for a particular title and, the next thing you know, you've got an armload of interesting things you can't wait to sit down with. Browsing expands your horizons!

As I write this, the library has a display on "Books of the Unknown." That's got to tempt anyone. Just looking around, I also saw books on grilling with cover photos to make anyone drool. I wandered over to the oversized book collection and-- oh, my! There is this huge Tuscany cookbook with photos that make you think you're right there, and this incredible book of watercolors by Winslow Homer. You could lose yourself in these pages for hours.

So okay, maybe you don't have hours. If you really

are too busy to hang around at the library, at least be savvy about online browsing. Take a few extra minutes to acquaint yourself with the great tools your library has for you. Check out the RPL website. Under the Fiction, Movies & Music tab, you'll find all sorts of juicy picks under New Materials as well as amazing suggestions when you use Novelist Plus. Give them a try. You'll be amazed at what you find yourself reading next!
