

## **Rochester Reads Ends with Visit by Author Tony Horwitz**



Rochester Reads 2012 concluded on April 9th with the guest visit of author Tony Horwitz whose two Civil War-era books, *Confederates in the Attic* and *Midnight Rising*, were the feature of this year's Rochester Reads.

Horwitz spoke before an audience of more than 200 people at Willow Creek Middle school, where he highlighted the life of John Brown in the years leading up to his secret raid on Harper's Ferry and which ignited the war between the North and South.

Horwitz spoke for about 45 minutes and then opened the floor to questions from the audience, where he was peppered with countless questions about both books, his thoughts on the mental process which led John Brown to organize the uprising, and his research and writing process. Horwitz then met individually with audience members and signed copies of his books.

Prior to the evening's events, Horwitz was given a guided tour of the Mayo Clinic buildings including the History of Mayo Exhibition, where Horwitz found a photograph of his grandfather, who had been a Mayo Clinic Surgeon in the 1920s under Dr. Will Mayo.

*Book Talk with Friends*, a special event held on March 8th at Rochester's Plummer House, was a great success and raised nearly \$450 to support the Rochester Public Library.

42 attendees came to hear author Ken Allsen give a power point presentation about his latest book, *Old Frontenac, Its History and Architecture.* His informal style and the stories about the founding of a historical township on the Mississippi near Lake City, kept the audience enthralled. After his presentation many questions were asked about those intrepid founders who started Old Frontenac before the Civil War. Ken was able to not only tell the historical side, he could also update the story to current times.

The Plummer House, with its local history and spacious rooms, is a great place to host such an event. In keeping with the Minnesota history theme that Ken Allsen's talk detailed, the Friends of the Rochester Public Library had a selection of Minnesota Mystery writers, as well as special and unique books of regional interest for sale.


