STOCKED UP: EVEN DURING A CHALLENGING YEAR, RPL CUSTOMERS HAVE ACCESS TO BOOKS

"Responding to a pandemic was not taught in library school," says Library Director Audrey Betcher, adding, "Thankfully we have a nimble, creative staff who continue to develop new ways to offer services."

Throughout the last year, services have changed dramatically at Rochester Public Library (RPL). With a unique library location (one of the busiest, most visited libraries in the state), library staff knew it would be difficult to offer "business as usual" during the health crisis. At the same time, community members needed books, movies, and access to the internet.

Generating new service models may sound simple enough, but processes, procedures, limited space, city-mandated health and safety protocols, and uncertainty about the future of the health crisis meant any new delivery system needed a thought-out plan. The following are different ways staff implemented materials delivery systems over the past year:

MARCH, 2020: Online Resources Within days of closing the library's doors, use of the online OverDrive/Libby resources skyrocketed. Staff adjusted the purchasing budget to reflect greatest need. Compared with 2019 use, digital checkouts increased 35% in 2020.

MORE LEAKS PLAGUE LIBRARY

A faulty pipe connector led to a small water leak at the library in March, leaving some small damage to the Friends' Bookstore but major damage to boxes of previously donated books.

While the leak was caught in time to prevent major damage to the library building, more than 400 books were ruined. The books had been carefully curated by Bookstore volunteers, and were ready to add into the store's inventory. The space has been repaired, and volunteers are once again able to use the store to complete a digital inventory.

While the recent water leak created damage to the Friends' store, it pales in comparison to the 2019 water leak at the library, which took almost six months to repair and included new carpet, ceiling tiles, and wall coverings.

The Friends' Bookstore Management is excited to announce that we are working toward having our bookstore go virtual.

With the aid of Reference Librarian Susan Hansen, we have begun scanning our bookstore books to compile an inventory.

Even though our physical Friends' Bookstore is temporarily closed as a preventive measure, we are hoping to allow you the option to browse books online and purchase for grab-and-go pickup.

A recent water leak in the store interrupted this project, but we hope to get back to work soon, to continue expanding the online storefront.

We also look forward to the time when we will be



able to safely reopen our bookstore. Thanks to our wonderful customers, book donors and hardworking volunteers, the Friends typically raise over \$70,000 annually from the sale of used books, CDs, DVDs, games and puzzles.

All proceeds from the bookstore benefit Rochester Public Library.

LIBRARY BUILDING SPACE NEEDS

The library has struggled with a lack of space even before the building opened in 1995. Branches, location, and current economic conditions have been discussed throughout the last three decades. In January 2021, the Library Board shared their position on addressing space needs.

THE LIBRARY BOARD IS UNWAVERING IN ITS BELIEF THAT:

The Library has outgrown its current space and must continue planning for the future.

2 The Library must maintain a downtown presence.

WHY DOWNTOWN?

The Board recognizes that the library is centrally located for the library service area (which includes all four quadrants of Rochester, as well as Byron and Dover/Eyota). Currently, downtown is the only location with reliable, consistent bus transportation and also the most centrally located area.

WHY NOT BRANCHES?

Branches continue to be a part of our discussion, but the downtown location needs to be addressed first. Branches may play a role in the future, but ongoing operational costs will need to be considered. Additionally, there is still a lot of work for city planners to do before branch location(s) could be determined: transit routes, zoning, and other factors are yet to be decided. For over 60 years, the RPL Bookmobile has served as a mobile branch of the library, delivering resources throughout the community. It is often the busiest bookmobile in the state, based on annual circulation statistics.



WHY NOW? DURING A PANDEMIC?

The library has been undersized for years, and the problem will continue to grow along with the city's population growth. Historically, libraries tend to be more heavily utilized following years of economic downturn as community members look to libraries for information and resources. The COVID-19 health crisis has highlighted racial and socio-economic inequities in our nation. Libraries will continue to be a valuable resource for the community, post-COVID, especially for under-resourced populations.

APRIL, 2020: Delivery was offered to area households, with library staff dropping materials off in the driveways, porches, and entryways of local residents. This labor-intensive service was originally offered to anyone who was interested, but once Curbside options started, delivery was geared only towards those who couldn't leave their homes. In the first month, 231 individual deliveries were made, with hundreds of items dropped off. The service ended in October, as demand for other services increased.

APRIL, 2020: Curbside Pickup was launched, and soon became incredibly popular. During the early months, cars were often lined up around the block, stretching to Broadway Avenue. By mid-summer, the system was working well, with staff efficiencies added to reduce wait times. When cooler weather began arriving, staff made plans for two new services: Curbside in the Ramp (by appointment) and Walkup Windows.

JUNE, 2020: Bookmobile Holds Pickup added another option for accessing materials. Staff created a new route, with longer stops, to make sure each location provided adequate time for picking up holds. Visits to the



Bookmobile helped alleviate pressure downtown, and also gave Bookmobile "regulars" the option to have easier access to library materials.




OCTOBER, 2020: Curbside in the Ramp allowed for continued delivery of items to people in their vehicles, as the cooler temperatures arrived. This service proved to be labor-intensive, but necessary as the pandemic worsened through the late fall and early winter months. In all, between October 2020 and March 2021: 10,471 pickups were scheduled for RPL customers.

NOVEMBER, 2020: Walkup Windows Thanks to CARES Act funding, the library was able to install two windows for delivering holds.

Similar to bank teller windows, these devices allow library staff to safely pass items from inside the library to customers waiting outside.

MARCH, 2021: Library Express While community members expressed gratitude for being able to borrow items throughout the pandemic, many people said they really missed browsing the stacks. Starting on March 11, 2021, visitors were able to return to the library for browsing



With so many options for distributing materials to community members, we will continue to adapt to the changing situation to provide the best service possible.


