FINE FREE INITIATIVE IMPROVES ACCESS, REDUCES STRESS

In June 2020, Rochester Public Library Board of Trustees approved the elimination of overdue fines for cardholders. Six months later, RPL conducted a survey of library cardholders to evaluate outcomes.

FOR THOSE EXPERIENCING FINANCIAL STRESS

Overall, 17%* of respondents reported feeling financially stressed. Surveys show that these individuals and families benefited most from the Fine Free Initiative.

76% said going fine free reduced their financial stress.

72% said going fine free helped them or their families access the materials they needed during the pandemic.

63% said going fine free helped them and/or their families to use curbside services.


CARDHOLDERS EXPERIENCING FINANCIAL STRESS
