Library Construction: Time for a New Roof

A dry library is a happy library. As you may know, the Rochester Public Library hasn't always been dry. With random leaks in the roof, it was finally time to take the steps needed to keep the library dry moving forward. Since construction of the facility in 1995, the roof has only had small updates completed over the years. However, the library's roof was clearly beyond its life, and will now be replaced to seal up any weather-related problems and contribute to the energy efficiency of the building.

This two-month project began on August 15, when Merit Construction rolled up with a larger-than-life vacuum system, crane, and scaffolding. To begin the process, all the rocks covering the library's roof – which had been used to hold down the multiple layers that make up the seal on the roof – had to be removed through a large vacuum. With the loss of the rock weight on the roof,





Merit hoisted used tires to take their place and spread them across the top of the building. Library Director Karen Lemke shared that, "We're grateful for this important work, knowing it will protect one of the city's most-visited assets."

Update from the Director

In my first six months as director at Rochester Public Library (RPL), it's only fitting that we, as an organization, are also experiencing several other "firsts."

This was our first full summer of the current 7 day a week schedule with all-day Sunday hours. The

move to offer additional hours on the weekends, and on Sundays in particular, was supported

by community members' feedback about their preferred times to use the downtown library. An overwhelming majority of respondents in a 2021 Hours Survey indicated that weekend hours are preferred over other days of the week. Fifty percent of respondents chose Saturday or Sunday as the best time for them or their families to use the library.

Having these hours provides us a chance

to be a space that individuals and families can enjoy when work schedules and other commitments don't allow for library visits during the traditional workweek. One survey respondent shared "I love that the library is open more hours...especially on Fri/Sat/Sun. The hours it was closed before were often the exact ones I wanted to visit... The new schedule is great!" Later this year we will also be launching our first-ever BookBox, a library vending machine that will offer free access to books, CDs, and DVDs for all library card holders. The box will reside inside City of Rochester Fire Station #4 (1875 41st Street NW).

We are also celebrating a community-led initiative to provide Community IDs. Community members first approached the library board in 2020, and the Rochester City Council approved an ordinance to operate a community ID program in August of this year. These identification cards will require the

> same documentation used to obtain a library card (and will even work as a library card!).

> These "firsts" will have a lasting impact on our community. I am grateful for the talented teammates, volunteers, and library supporters who have invested additional time and energy into these initiatives to create first-class experiences for our community.
