Friends -- Rochesterfest

The Friends of the Rochester Public Library will be selling Rochesterfest buttons this year in the Friends' Bookstore. The Friends' garage is sale is Wednesday 6/22 from 9 AM to 5 PM and Thursday 6/23 from 9 AM to 3 PM. Members of the Friends are invited to a presale at 8:30 AM on Wednesday morning. To become a Friends' member call 287-2627. The Friends are holding a silent auction of quality books inside the library on Wednesday afternoon from noon to 6 PM.



Library staff will participate in the Rochesterfest parade on Friday 6/24. The library entry is entitled "Books Come Alive" and staff will be dressed as characters from the children's book, "Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs." The library is hosting McGruff's Birthday party on Saturday 6/25 at 10 AM in front of the Rochester Civic Theater. The library joins the National Night Out, Crime Prevention Unit, and the Rochester Police Department to help McGruff "Take a bite out of Crime". Crime rates are statistically linked to literacy rates (over 80% of young people sentenced to prison can barely read).

The library is promoting early childhood literacy as a means to reduce crime in the community!

24/7 Reference Service

It's 3:00 in the morning and a student is feverishly trying to locate an elusive statistic she needs for her history paper which is due in a few hours. At 9:15 pm a newcomer to the community would like to reserve an audiocassette of learning Spanish, but doesn't know how to navigate the library catalog, and can't take the time when she's in the library with her two small children. A soccer dad, leaving in minutes at 8:00 am, needs directions to the National Soccer Complex in Blaine.

Whether it's noon or the wee hours of the morning, information seekers with internet access can be assisted by the Rochester Public Library, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. By logging into the library's web site, http://www.rochesterpubliclibrary.org, clicking on research page, and then clicking on the large 24/7 reference box, users will be connected to professional librarians who will help them find the information they need.

24/7 reference service is a collaborative effort of hundreds of librarians across the country. Their knowledge of catalogs, searching techniques, diverse databases as well as around the clock coverage has assisted thousands of local users in navigating the myriad resources available online. Using a 'chat' format similar to "Instant messaging", librarians can often answer questions immediately, or email an answer to a patron within several days. A unique 'cobrowsing' feature will allow the librarian and inquirer to see the same screens as the websites or library catalogs are searched.

Rochester Public Library participates in 24/7 by covering the 'lines' 2 hours per day, Monday through Friday. In 2004, our staff answered 1,704 questions, and 623 local patrons used the service.

Because the service is staffed with librarians anywhere from Boston to Los Angeles and in between, local questions like "How much are my fines?", "What side of the library is the bookdrop on?", are best answered by calling the library during open hours at 285-8002 or emailing reference@rochester.lib.mn.us.
