December 5! Don't miss the second annual Holiday Books & Bake Sale in the Library Auditorium. Doors open 1:30 - 5:00.


Enjoy live entertainment, as John Hulsizer plays festive piano music. The



From the Director Storytime Kits are a big hit with area day-care providers



In late September 2004 the Rochester
Public Library (RPL) mailed an informational/promotional
letter announcing the kick-off of the new RPL Storytime Kits
to approximately 500 daycare providers in Olmsted County.
The list was provided by Child Care Resource and Referral
Inc. In no time at all the RPL Children's Division received
more than one-hundred requests to reserve the new Storytime
Kits. The reserve list is growing every day.

So what's a Storytime kit and why is RPL promoting it? A Storytime kit is a tool designed for daycare providers to use to introduce their young, preschool children to reading and learning. Kits include books, audio and video tapes/discs, stuffed animals, toys, puppets, activity sheets, and educational tools. Topics cover a wide variety of subjects such as dinosaurs, seasons of the year, hats and music. We have twenty-five different subjects and we're assembling more as funds become available.

In many ways, the Storytime kit is the next logical step after the Read with Me program adopted by the *Friends of the Library*. Both promote early childhood literacy.

These kits were made possible through the generosity of the Rochester Public Library Foundation, the Judy and Jim Sloan Foundation and Rochester Wal-Mart North. Kits can be "checked-out" for a week at a time, free of charge, by daycare providers.

We've all read studies showing that reading to and with young children is vital to making them readers and learners all through life. According to the Southern Minnesota Initiative Foundation, "Studies have proven that investing in early childhood programs pays big dividends for businesses and communities. Every dollar spent on quality child development saves \$7 in negative outcomes."

We also acknowledge that childcare providers are an essential element in modeling reading behavior to children and their parents, promoting literacy, and encouraging library use. With high transportation insurance costs and lack of staff it is difficult or sometimes impossible for many childcare providers to bring children to the library. Storytime kits provide a link to the library and its materials when library visits are not possible.

I am on the First Steps Advisory, part of the Rochester Area Foundation's effort to bring partners together to increase school readiness and success of all young people. The *Friends* were years ahead of the community in funding creative ways to get books into the hands of babies!



Practice time is included. Registration required.




Barnes & Noble


