Monday, March 22nd? The article provided an overview of
some of the services in which seniors may be interested.
Here are the highlights:

Computer classes - There is even an "Internet for Seniors" class. See facing page.

Heritage Quest - a database that is great for genealogy research. The library also has a class periodically on using the Internet for genealogy research. Reference staff can help you with the database and let you know when the next class will be. (285-8002)

Book groups - The library has many book groups going and is starting a couple more. Some of the current groups include Minnesota Authors, Plain Readers, Books into Film. Contact the Readers Services desk for more information. (285-8006)

Homebound services - If a person has barriers in getting to the library, volunteers can deliver materials to your home once a month. This can even be used in a temporary situation. Perhaps if you are recovering from surgery, you could have the service for several months. Readers Services is the contact. (285-8019)

Internet services - If you don't have a computer at home, you can use the Internet access at the library. With your library card, you can have at least an hour per day (sometimes 90 minutes if no one is waiting).

Bookmobile - The bookmobile makes between 60 and 70 stops every two weeks. There may be a stop near you!

Varied Collection - The library has more than books. We have DVD, videos, described videos, audio books on tape and CD, music on tape and CD, and large print books.

Workstation for people with low vision - The library has a workstation on the second floor to assist people with low vision. Special software is loaded on the computer to either Zoom the text very large on the screen or even read a written page.






